String quartet music is heard in prestigious concert halls and in living rooms. It is called up to entertain country leaders, but is also enjoyed by the most unsophisticated of audiences.

When, where, and how did the remarkable journey of the string quartet begin? Why did it become so popular? We answer these and many other questions during our highly entertaining and informative program, A History of the String Quartet.

Our unique History of the String Quartet program prefaces each work or excerpt by a brief introduction by one of the members of the Kontras Quartet. The program, which can be tailored to any type of audience, delivers a satisfying blend of music by the great string quartet composers, and by composers from each of our home countries. For instance, audiences might hear how African ethnic folk music has been incorporated into the string quartet format; learn how Mendelssohn was influenced by his predecessors; or learn about the unique place that string quartet repertoire (and classical music in general) occupies in modern Japanese culture.

Tour three centuries of string quartet repertoire with us, explore the evolution of the genre, and enjoy musical selections ranging from Telemann to television, and everything in between.
